#### HISTORY

Toward the end of the 1930's, the United States was becoming more involved with the war in Europe. More pilots were needed for what seemed an inevitable second world war. The Navy saw a need for a new and larger pilot training facility and its eyes fell on Corpus Christi. Commissioned on March 12, 1941, Naval Air Station Corpus Christi commenced flight operations. Following four weeks of ground training, the first of the original class of 52 students took off at 0947 on 5 May, 1941 in a Stearman trainer to log the first training flight. NAS was graduating 300 new aviators each month by the end of that year. After the attack on Pearl Harbor, the

number of graduating Oaviators rose to 600 a month. During World War II the station was used to train aviation cadets as flyers, navigators, aerologists, gunners, and radio operators.

In 1961, ARADMAC (Army Aeronautical Depot Maintenance Center) came into being. Today it is known as Corpus Christi Army Depot (CCAD), and is the largest tenant command at NAS Corpus Christi. CCAD occupies nearly 140 acres leased from the station and is the largest industrial employer in South Texas. Established in 1961 as a relatively small maintenance facility for fixed wing aircraft, CCAD evolved into the Army's largest helicopter repair, overhaul and maintenance center.

In 1972, Naval Air Training Command Headquarters moved to Corpus Christi from Pensacola, Florida, and established Training Air Wing Four. Since the 1940's, NAS exerted a strong and lasting influence on Corpus Christi and on South Texas. It brought new jobs and new cultures to the region and contributed to the city's growth as it continues to do so today.

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THIS BASE:** Operator & Passenger(s) of a motor vehicle are prohibited from having open containers of alcoholic beverages in their possession. Radar detector devices are prohibited. Motor- cyclists must have protective clothing and take a motorcycle safety course on base prior to registering their motorcycle.

**Seat Belts:** In Texas, seat belts are mandatory for the driver and front seat passengers 5 years of age and over and all children between the ages of 2 and 4, regardless of location in the vehicle. Approved child seats are required for all children up to 2 years old.

**Drinking Laws:** Texas law is very strict about drinking and driving. The maximum penalty for DWI (1st offense) is two years in jail, suspension of operator's license and a \$2,000 fine. DWI is a "serious" subject. The doctrine of "implies consent" to a breath test exists in Texas. Refusal to take a breath-alyzer test can result in loss of driver's license. Police check-point stops are a valid, common practice in Corpus Christi and surrounding areas.

**Driver's License:** A valid operator's license from another state is accepted in Texas for you and your family members. However, if your spouse should become employed in the state during your tour of duty in Texas, she/he has 30 days to obtain a Texas driver's license.

\*\*\*\*\* HEADS UP \*\*\*\*\*

Automobile insurance in Corpus Christi is relatively expensive compared to other states. **BE SURE TO SHOP AROUND FOR THE BEST DEALS.**

NAS Corpus Christi has no enlisted galley, and is currently a **CRITICAL HOUSING SHORTAGE LOCATION.** Corpus Christi has very high humidity levels throughout the year. If you suffer from asthma or allergies please bring medications to last until you are able to make an appointment with the Naval Hospital.

## Regulations

### TRAFFIC:

All drivers in the State of Texas must carry automobile insurance. Coverage must at least meet State minimum requirements. Speed limit on Naval Air Station Corpus Christi is 30 mph unless otherwise posted and is enforced by roving police patrols equipped with radar. Seat Belts are required at all times while driving on base. Child seats/restraints are mandatory for children under 40 pounds or under 4 years of age. Parking of motor vehicles is authorized only in those areas/spaces designated for parking.

If a vehicle operator (military or civilian) is stopped by Security Police for a traffic violation or routine identification check, full cooperation with the patrol officer or gate guard is required by producing any and all identification.

Pedestrians in crosswalks have the right of way. However, they should not step into crosswalks in the path of approaching vehicles when such action would require emergency braking on the part of the vehicle operator. Pedestrians must consider surface road conditions prior to entering the crosswalk. In addition any traffic violation on the station will be counted against the Texas driving record.

### VEHICLE CHECKS:

All vehicles entering or leaving NAS Corpus Christi are subject to search.

### ACCIDENTS:

All motor vehicle accidents must be reported to the Security Police Desk Sergeant, Building 104, D Street, immediately, no matter how minor the accident may appear.

### VEHICLE REGISTRATION:

Personnel driving privately owned automobiles aboard the station should proceed to the Security Department Pass and Tag Office, Building 198 (adjacent to South Gate), to register their vehicle within FIVE days after reporting aboard. Persons must have a valid driver's license, current automobile registration and certified possession of 15-30-15 liability insurance to file for registration. All vehicles must have an annual state inspection if the state requires an inspection. Vehicles manufactured after 1967 must be equipped with seat belts. Persons may register their vehicles from 7:30 a.m. to 3:45 p.m.

Monday through Friday at the Vehicle Registration Office located in Building 198.

All motor vehicles registered in Texas, including motorcycles, motor scooters and mopeds, must be inspected each year by an official motor vehicle inspection station. This can be done on base at the Hobby Shop.

Automobile insurance premiums will vary according to the type of car and individual driving record and age.

### WEAPON SAFETY:

Unauthorized firearms are not allowed on NAS Corpus Christi. All personnel residing on the station must register their weapons with Security.

### RESTRICTED AREAS:

Privately owned vehicles may not enter restricted areas.

### PHOTOGRAPHY:

Photography on NAS is prohibited in most areas unless prior approval is obtained from the Public Affairs Office. For information on photography, call 961-2568/2674.

All persons who reside in Texas and wish to operate a motor vehicle; automobile, motorcycle, or other self-propelled vehicle on public streets, must be licensed as either an Operator, Commercial, or Chauffeur up to Class A, B, C, and M. The Class C license allows operation of all vehicles under 24,000 gross vehicle weight and 2 axles. They may pull a trailer not over 10,000 gross vehicle weight and if pulling a trailer over 10,000 pounds gross weight. Motorcycle operation requires a class M license.

New residents who are properly licensed have 30 days after entry into the State to secure a Texas driver's license. During this period, new residents may operate as an operator only. However, active duty military members with a valid out of state license need not apply for a Texas driver's license.

The Department maintains an office at 1922 S. Padre Island Drive, which is open from 8:00 to 5:00 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and 8:00 a.m. to 7p.m. on Wednesdays to assist persons desiring a Texas Driver's License. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age unless they present a school enrollment verification form number PPD043 along with a certificate showing completion of an approved driver education course.

#### TO OBTAIN A DRIVERS' LICENSE YOU MUST HAVE:

1. A valid drivers license from another state. (If you don't have a valid license) you will need to take the complete written test, the road test, and the vision test.

2. If you have no license, you must show Birth Certificate for verification of name and date of birth.

3. Show your original Social Security Card. (Forms to secure a new card or have a name change on the Social Security card are available at the Family Service Center). The forms are mailed to the Social Security Administration office by the person requesting such actions.

When a non-resident vehicle owner or operator establishes residency in Texas or enters into gainful employment (not military pay), his or her vehicle(s) may be operated for 30 days thereafter, after which time the vehicle must be registered in Texas. You must show proof of insurance and a valid inspection sticker. Active duty personnel that have out-of-state tags that have expired must be registered with the state of Texas and show proof of title.

**FISHING AND HUNTING LICENSE:** Licenses are sold at most sporting goods and tackle stores, county courthouses, Parks & Wildlife Dept. offices, and by some, not all, local game wardens. All annual licenses are valid from Sept 1 through the following Aug 31, regardless of when purchased.

**A FISHING LICENSES:** A fishing license is required for all nonresident fishermen. For residents, only those between 17 and 65 years of age are required to have a fishing license.

Saltwater stamps and freshwater trout stamps are not required for those who are exempt from fishing licenses.

**HUNTING AND FISHING IN MEXICO:** Mexican authorities must be contacted for current regulations, hunting and fishing licenses, and procedures for taking in firearms and ammunition. Any game legally taken in Mexico may be brought into Texas, but must be accompanied by a statement, issued by U.S. Customs at the border, that the game originated in Mexico. There are no restrictions on bringing fish caught in Mexico into Texas, but they must be declared at the Texas port-of-entry.

#### FISHING FACTS

All types of fishing are available in the Coastal Bend, shallow water, deep water and fresh water. Redfish, speckled trout, sand trout, drum and flounder are caught all year round. Tarpon, mackerel, jackfish and pompano are best caught from April through October. In Texas, both fresh and salt water fishing requires a license and it is unlawful to fish under the license of another person. There is an annual fee for licenses or a temporary 5 day license.

## Local Community

### Local Community Overview

In 1519, Spanish explorer Alonso Alvarez de Pineda discovered what he reported as "a beautiful bay." Since the discovery occurred on the religious feast day of Corpus Christi (The Body of Christ), he gave that name to the bay. Eventually the name carried over to the city. Today most Texans shorten that name to Corpus, but the abbreviated version is frowned on by most residents of the city.

It was 1839, more than three centuries after Pineda's discovery, that a frontier trading post was set up near what is now the 400 block of Broadway, and a colony slowly grew up around it. The Mexican War gave the colony its first spurt of growth. While waiting for the diplomats to try their hand at settling the Texas border dispute with Mexico, General Zachary Taylor and a small army was sent to Corpus Christi to be ready to move south if diplomacy failed. The Army set up a tent city in what is now Artesian Park near

downtown. Diplomacy did fail and Taylor and his men moved off to war, but by then Corpus Christi was established as a supply point for the Mexican war, and when that war ended, it continued to be a supply point supporting operations in the West.

As years went by, the port became a shipping point for Texas cattle and crops, and the town grew up around it. But it was a U.S. government decision in the 1920s to turn Corpus Christi into a deep-water port that really put the city on the map. The drudges came and turned it into what is still the deepest port on the Texas coast. The city itself sits like a quarter moon hugging the bay. From the air it looks long

and thin, as if everyone was trying to get as close to the water as possible.

## Education

### Education Overview

The Coastal Bend Area has 40 plus schools in the area. State law requires a child to be five years of age on or before 1 September for Kindergarten, and six years of age on or before 1 September for First Grade. Birth certificates are required for children enrolling in school for the first time. State law makes it mandatory for parents to present sufficient evidence that the child has been protected against polio, diphtheria, pertusis, tetanus, red measles (rubella) and tuberculosis (PPD). Children will not be allowed to start school until necessary immunizations have been obtained and actual dates have been provided to the school. Parents are also required to present the child's social security card, last report card and official transcript from previous school - if applicable, and proof of residence.

Public schools normally start the third week in August and run through the last week in May, with the standard holidays being observed. However, you should check with the school in particular for the actual dates.

The Corpus Christi Independent School District, the largest of five school districts within the city limits of Corpus Christi, is among the eight largest urban school districts in Texas. The District has 63 campuses which serve approximately 42,200 students in prekindergarten through grade 12. An instructional staff of more than 2,600 classroom teachers is complimented by a support staff of more than 2,000.

There are five senior high schools, 11 middle schools, 39 elementary schools; and 8 special campuses. In ethnic composition the District is approximately 68 percent Hispanic, 26 percent White and 6 percent Black.

High Schools have regular and honor programs; grades and career pursuits determine program placement. Each high school has its own program called Operation Intervention which allows students to work at their own pace. There is a night school located at Moody High School, hours 4:00 to 9:00 or 10:00 p.m. NJROTC is offered at all High Schools.

The Middle Schools contain grades 6,7 & 8. One middle school Baker, is part of the Athena Program for gifted and talented students. Admittance is determined by scores on test administered in the spring, summer and fall and by teacher recommendation.

One of the 39 elementary schools, Windsor Park, provides a program for the gifted and talented, representing the top 3% of the elementary students in the district. Admittance to the program is determined by scores from tests given in the spring, summer and fall and by teacher recommendation. One of the 39 elementary schools, Chula Vista Academy of Fine Arts emphasizes art, music, and drama in addition to reading, mathematics, and composition. Students must demonstrate interest in the arts and apply for admission.

Special Emphasis Schools (SES) are located at seven elementary schools and one middle school. The SES setting is based on the belief that some students do best in a highly structured curriculum. Strong emphasis is placed on basic skills, good citizenship, discipline, and enrichment.

### ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to attend the school appropriate for the student's grade level within the attendance area where the student's parent or legal guardian resides. Some district - approved transfers are available.

Texas State law requires that a child be five years of age on or before 1 of September to be able to attend public schools. Birth certificates are required for children enrolling in the school for the first time. State law makes it mandatory for parents to present sufficient evidence that the child has been protected against polio, diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, red measles, and tuberculosis. Children will not be allowed to start school until necessary immunizations have been obtained and actual dates have been provided to the school.

A certified birth certificate or other document which proves the student's identity must be furnished to the District within 30 days of enrollment.

All students must be immunized against certain diseases or must present a certificate or statement indicating that, for medical or religious reasons, the students should not be immunized. State law requires the following immunizations: diphtheria, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps, rubella, and hemophilias influenza.

Our goal is to help prepare the individual for a successful job search by orienting the individual to the economic area, reviewing resumes, enumerating the resources available, and detailing the techniques and strategies necessary for success, and to educate individuals to understand the employer mind, to recognize their own value and potential, to be able to express their assets to the employer through written and oral communication, and thus to succeed in obtaining their employment goals. Positions in the health field are readily available due to a high concentration of medical facilities. Registered nurses generally are able to earn comparable salaries to outside areas. Other occupations may experience a decrease in salary. The remainder of the job sector provides opportunities in services, sales and administrative positions, while highly specialized and professional positions are limited.

In January of 1999 Corpus Christi had an unemployment rate of 6.9%. Twelve thousand one hundred and thirty three (12,133) individuals were receiving unemployment benefits. The national unemployment rate was 4.5% during that time period. The cost of living is about the same as most other commands due to military subsidies and benefits. The wages however, in some cases, are about 30% less.

Spouse Employment Preference is a preference for employment in DoD civilian positions for which the military spouse is best qualified at Grade Levels GS-5 through GS/GM (or equivalent wage system positions). Preference for NAFI positions is at Grade UA-8 and below (and equivalent positions) and for those jobs paid at an hourly rate. Depending on qualifications and experience, the spouse is afforded serious consideration for competitive civil service vacancies.

If the spouse has previous government work experience, preference can be exercised up to the highest grade level ever held. Spouses of active duty military personnel of the DoD with personal civil service status (i.e., current career or career-conditional employees, reinstatement eligibles) should apply with the Human Resource Office for available positions. This office can explain in detail the application process.

The following "Questions and Answers" on Military Spouse Preference (as published in the HRO NEWS, Winter 1997 Issue, by HRO Pensacola, FL) should clarify some things:

Who is eligible? Military spouses who currently hold or have held a permanent position with the Federal government.

How are they referred to jobs? Thirty days prior to his/her spouse's reporting date to the new duty station, the military spouse may register as a Preference Eligible and be referred for positions at the new location for which he/she qualifies and

which are no higher than those he/she has held before.

What is meant by "Preference" in this situation? The military spouses are classified as "Priority Placement Program" eligibles, also known as the "Stopper List." That means that they must be selected over candidates with no such preference when determined fully qualified and referred. Of course, candidates with Priority 1 or 2 (generally speaking, those who are about to be or have been separated or downgraded in a reduction in force) would have higher preference.

Where does the spouse register for this program? He/she can register either at the Human Resource Office at his/her current location or at the HRO at the new location.

What are the program's advantages? The advantages are twofold: First, the employer-DoD benefits because military spouses, having had the opportunity to move from base to base and work in different kinds of positions, often have a wealth of experience and valuable skills to offer. Secondly, the benefit for the employee is obvious-it greatly increases his/her chances of continued employment without a break in Federal Service.

Another thought to keep in mind is that you do not have to stay within the same Federal agency (i.e., Department of the Navy). You can consider working for other Federal agencies such as the Internal Revenue Service, Customs, Border Patrol, Food and Drug Administration, etc.

Some of you who may have been overseas may not know that the Federal government (all agencies) are downsizing. Downsizing involves the reduction of both military and civil service employees. The climate in all Federal agencies is shifting towards privatization, which may allow the government to better control unexpected shifts in workload. Privatization is the concept whereby work required by Federal agencies is performed via a contract bid/award transaction. Essentially this means that working for a contract company who performs services to Federal agencies is now becoming a viable source of employment to consider since you may experience severe pressure in the government jobs.

## Government Employment

Various types of government employment exists in the South Texas Area, including federal civil service (DOD and Non-DOD), state, county and city.

Federal Civilian Employment - Available Federal Civil Service employment can be accessed through computer modems in the Fleet & Family Support Center Employment Resource Room. Applications, including the SF-171, OF-612, and resume formats are available in the Spouse Employment Assistance Program (SEAP) Office.

Military spouses may qualify for the Priority Placement Program. The Priority Placement Program provides preference in employment for civilian positions and assistance in locating employment opportunities with the Department of Defense (DOD) in the same commuting area of the sponsor's duty station. "Preference" is priority in the selection process for military spouses when they are being considered along with others. It applies only when the spouse is among the best-qualified candidates. "Preference" does not mean tht positions are created or made available especially for spouses or that spouses have any special appointing authority or a guarantee that a job will be available.

Spouse preference is applied in several different ways, depending on how a position is being filled, its location, and whether you have "status" (meaning civil service status). "Status" applicants include current career/career-conditional employees, reinstatement eligibles, and prior overseas family member appointables.

State Employment - State employment in Texas can be accessed through the Texas Workforce Commission, and various departmental job posting lists which are regularly sent to the Fleet & Family Support Center Employment Resource Center.

TRICARE - The TRICARE area Region Six, which includes the states of Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and Texas, has programs available to beneficiaries to improve referral and access to care. The following is a brief explanation:

TRICARE PRIME - Prime is the least costly of the three TRICARE options. You will be able to predict your health care costs. It is a voluntary health maintenance organization type (HMO) option. You will be responsible for paying an annual enrollment fee (with the exception of the active duty families). The active duty family members will not pay an enrollment fee. You can choose or be assigned a Primary Care Manager (PCM) located at the Naval Hospital. The PCM will render medical care and will manage all aspects of your care, including referrals to specialists. The Health Care Finder (HCF), located at the Naval Hospital will assist in finding the appropriate specialty care for you.

Covered service will be the same regular CHAMPUS (now known as TRICARE STANDARD), plus additional preventive and primary care services that aren't covered under TRICARE Standard or Extra. For example, periodic health promotions/disease prevention surveillance screenings (most people think of them as routine exams. Prime covers certain immunizations, as well as examinations for various cancer and infectious and cardiovascular diseases, as well as other screenings, with certain age and frequency limitations.

There is less paperwork with Prime. When care is received from a provider who is part of the prime network, you do not have to file the claim. If you are active duty family member and referred by your PCM to a Specialist outside the Naval Hospital you will not be required to pay a co-payment. Other TRICARE Prime enrollees will be responsible for a \$12.00 co-payment.

If you travel out of your TRICARE Prime service area you must seek an authorization prior to receiving routine care. If you have an emergency (life, limb, death threatening emergencies), be sure to contact the Health Care Finder. The number to call is located on the back of your TRICARE Prime Card. Failure to obtain authorization will result in your bills being processed as Point of Service, which is very costly to you.

TRICARE STANDARD - You do not have to pay an annual enrollment fee. However, you do have to satisfy an annual deductible for outpatient care. For outpatient care for most families, there is a yearly

deductible of \$150.00 for one person or \$300.00 for a family. You will pay for your provider(s) the first \$150.00 (or for a family, \$300.00) worth of TRICARE Standard allowable medical bills in a fiscal year. The deductible for a family of active-duty E-4s and below is \$50.00 for an individual and \$100.00 for the entire family.

After deductible is met, active duty families pay 20 percent of the TRICARE Standard allowable charge for each medical bill (except for ambulatory surgery centers, free standing birthing centers and hospital based birthing rooms, for which the charge is a flat \$25.00. Retirees pay-Professional fee - 25% of TRICARE allowable Facility - 25% of TRICARE allowable or billed charges, whichever is less. If a health care provider who does not participate in TRICARE Standard bills you for more than the allowable charge, you also pay for additional amount, up to the legal limit of 15 percent above the TRICARE Standard allowable charge. The allowable charge is the maximum amount TRICARE Standard will pay for care given by physicians and other providers. It is determined by comparing the actual billed charges, the prevailing charges (what most providers have been charging) for a particular service, and a charge arrived at by applying a Medicare related formula - then using the lowest of the three as the TRICARE Standard allowable charge. You may be required to submit the claim and also may be required to pay the provider at the time of your visit.

A provider who participates in TRICARE Standard will send in the claim for your care to the TRICARE contractor. TRICARE Standard will send its share of your medical bills directly to the participating provider. You should arrange with the provider how and when to pay your part of the bill. The TRICARE contractor knows the allowable charge for the TRICARE Standard-covered care you receive. The deductible and patient cost-share is subtracted from that amount, unless you have already met the deductible for the year. The claims processor then sends your provider a check for the TRICARE Standard share of the remaining amount.

For families of active duty service members, the check will be for 80 percent of the remaining allowable amount. You must pay the other 20 percent, plus the deductible if it has not already been met, to your provider. (Except for a care in ambulatory surgery centers and free standing birthing centers).

For retirees, their families, families of service members who have died and for eligible former military spouses, the check will be for 75 percent of the remaining allowable amount. You must pay the provider the other 25 percent, plus the deductible if it has not already been paid.

\*\*\*\*\*All families also pay the full amount for any care that is not covered by TRICARE Standard.

#### FOR IMPATIENT STAY

Active duty family members pay \$10.85 per day or a minimum of \$25.00, whichever is greater. Retirees and all others pay the lesser of \$390.00 per day, or 25% of institutional services, plus 25% of professional charges. Maternity inpatient stay would be \$10.85 per day or \$25.00 minimum. All others pay \$390.00 per day or 25% of institutional services, plus 25% professional charges. For Mental Health - \$20.00 per day for active duty. All others 25% of costs. \*\*\*\*\* PREAUTHORIZATION IS REQUIRED!\*\*\*\*\*

#### TRICARE EXTRA

This option is the same as TRICARE Standard, with the exception when you seek a provider who participates in the TRICARE PRIME Network. You will get a discount of service for outpatient care. Five percent less than TRICARE Standard, and you will have reduced cost charges. You generally will not have to file the claim forms. You can get a list of participating providers by contacting TRICARE service center. On each visit-by-visit basis, you can seek a provider who participates in the network, which will save you some money.

#### ELIGIBILITY AND ENROLLMENT

Enrollment in the TRICARE - Active Duty Family Member Dental Plan is voluntary. Spouses and children of all active duty uniformed service members who live in the United States, District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands and Canada are eligible to enroll. Regardless of previous enrollment, all new enrollees must remain enrolled in the TRICARE Dental Plan at least 12 months. After completing 12 months minimum enrollment period, enrollment may continue on a month-to-month basis. Anyone who fails to pay premiums or disenrolls for other than a valid disenrollment reason (i.e., when a family member or sponsor loses DEERS eligibility due to death, divorce, marriage of a child, end of entitlement, or when a family member reaches age 21 (or 23 if full

time college student enrolled in a accredited college or university, etc.). To enroll fill out a United Concordia TRICARE Program 5572DP A. You can obtain the form by calling 1-888-622-2256. Website or thorough your local Health Benefits Advisor. All new enrollees must submit application with a payment equal to the member's portion of one-month premium.

Coverage begins after United Concordia receives an enrollment form. They query DEERS to confirm eligibility. Once eligibility is confirmed, United Concordia will enroll the member(s) in the TDP. Coverage is effective the first day of the month after the month in which a sponsor enrolls and one month's premium payment is received. If eligibility cannot be confirmed by United Concordia, the member(s) will be notified and instructed to contact his or her Uniformed Service personnel office to resolve the issue. It is highly recommended before receiving initial treatment, to ensure coverage is in effect and to confirm effective date of that coverage.

#### PREMIUM COST

For active duty family members and for Selected Reserve and IRR (Special Mobilization Category only) members, the government pays part of the monthly premium. IRR (other than special mobilization category) members and all selected Reserve and IRR family members are responsible for the full amount of the premium cost. See the following:

Active Duty Family Members  
Government pays 60% and enrollee pays 40%

Selected Reservist and IRR (Special Mobilization Category) Members  
Government pays 60% and enrollee pays 40%

IRR (other than special mobilization category)  
Enrollee pays 100%

Selected Reserve and IRR Family Members  
Enrollee pays 100%

## Housing

### Housing Overview

Once orders are received, arrangements for future housing can begin. The Housing Referral Office can provide you with the most up-to-date information about housing in the Corpus Christi area. Due to this one-stop shopping concept, military personnel arriving in the area are able to obtain the maximum amount of information with a minimum amount of time.

The Corpus Christi/Ingleside area is a Critical Housing Area (CHA). Military personnel due to transfer to this area would be wise to contact the local Housing Office upon receipt of orders to get more information on the housing situation at that time. For those families planning to visit the area on House hunting leave, plan on making the trip at least 30 days in advance of your permanent move. Due to the designation as a CHA, military personnel have the option of leaving their families behind until suitable housing is located. Families living in military family quarters can request permission through their local housing office to remain in base quarters. Check with your current base command or housing office to determine the correct procedures for this request. Another available option if your family is living off-base in suitable housing is to let them remain there and continue drawing BAH at the local rate or the Corpus Christi rate, whichever is higher.

Bridge Pointe Landing (361-643-4040) has implemented a Department of Navy public-private housing venture in Portland (approximately 20 miles from NAS Corpus Christi).

Residents can choose from 3 imaginative floor plans, ranging from 2 bedrooms (\$686.00), 3 bedrooms (\$756.00), and 4 bedrooms (\$915.00). The resident activity center offers a business service center, social room, and a fitness center. Only minutes from downtown Corpus Christi and superb quality schools, Bridge Pointe Landing is close to everywhere you need to be.

Features include an estate style pool with sunning deck, a cold spa, 3 baseball/soccer fields, 3 full court basketball facilities, 6 playlots, 10 totlots, 4 large picnic areas, covered parking for every home, 10 bus shelters, and 3 clothes care facilities.

### Financial Preparedness

Did you know that the average military family reports over \$500.00 in unreimbursed moving expenses when they PCS? Also, your financial situation will change when you relocate. You may have to significantly change your spending habits. Be prepared! Set up a "spending plan" before changes occur following these steps:

1. Know how much money you will have to spend. Write down income before, after, and during your transfer. There are a variety of special pays and allowances available to service members making a PCS move. Check with your disbursing office to determine your specific entitlements. Take into account current and projected income; VHA level, spouses' income, sea pay, repayment of advanced pay, etc.
  2. Know where your money goes. Track current expenses. Project your in-route, and future expenses. Plan for temporary lodging, transportation, food and hotel costs in-route. Consider housing expenses, cost of living, auto insurance, day care costs, etc.
  3. Compare current and projected income and expenses. Make adjustments as necessary.
  4. Look for ways to increase income, decrease expenses, and decrease indebtedness.
  5. Communicate with your creditors. Inform them of your change of address and if necessary inform them of any situation that would prevent you from paying your just financial obligations in a proper and timely manner.
  6. Maintain adequate insurance coverage, and build your savings for emergencies.
- \*\*\*\*\*HERE ARE SOME PLANNING TIPS\*\*\*\*\*
- \*PAY YOURSELF FIRST! If you plan to save the money that remains at the end of the month, there won't be any! Pay yourself first by making an allotment to savings.
- \*BUDGET FOR NECESSITIES! Understand the difference between "needs" and "wants". Be realistic about what are truly necessities. Budget for essentials, and allow for non-essentials as your spending plan permits.

\*ALWAYS SET ASIDE MONEY FOR EMERGENCIES! You can not predict emergency travel, car repairs, etc. However, you can prepare for a financial emergency with adequate savings.

\*BASE YOUR SPENDING PLAN ON THE INCOME YOU KNOW! Many people make the mistake of basing their budget on temporary sources of income and find it very difficult to lower their standard of living when the temporary source of income no longer exists.

\*EVALUATE YOUR FINANCIAL CAPABILITIES. Prior to acceptance of any credit plan or requesting advance pay, evaluate your financial capabilities to preclude an over burdening and ever increasing debt load.

"PEOPLE DON'T PLAN TO FAIL, THEY FAIL TO PLAN!" A spending plan will allow you to take control of your finances, instead of having your finances control you!

### **Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP)**

The EFM Program is a mandatory enrollment program per OPNAVINST 1751.2 (series) that identifies long term medical and special educational needs of family members and ensures assignment considerations of those needs when transferring. To ensure special needs of family members are considered during the assignment process, service members are required to enroll when the special needs are identified at least nine months prior to Projection Rotation Date (PRD). This provides your detailer time to work your next assignment and consider your family member's special needs as well as your career needs and the Navy's needs. This program is open to any authorized family member who meets the following criteria: Physical, emotional, or other disability, and/or long term chronic illness, and/or long term special educational needs. The family member must be enrolled in DEERS and reside with the sponsor.

The Personal Property Transportation Office (PPTO), Bldg 10, is open 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Mondays through Fridays. ### Household Goods Claims

If you discover loss or damage, upon delivery, you are required to list the loss or damage on the "Joining Statement of Loss or Damage at Deliver" (DD Form 1840). The carrier or the carrier's representative will provide you with this form at the time of delivery. This form is to be completed jointly by you and the carrier or carrier's representative who is delivering the shipment. The DD Form 1840 serves as a notice to the carrier of loss or damage and a receipt of delivery.

If you discover additional loss or damage not annotated on the DD Form 1840, you must use the "Notice of Loss or Damage" (DD Form 1840-R) on the reverse of the DD Form 1840. You have up to 70 days to inspect your property and record all loss or damage. In all instances the completed DD Forms 1840/1840-R must be delivered to you local claims office no later than 70 days from date of delivery. Failure to deliver the form or list all items may result in a reduction of the amount payable on your claim.

Upon receipt of you DD 18-10R, you will be given a claim packet. This packet must be completed and turned in within two years from the date your shipment was delivered. However, to assure prompt settlement, claims should be filed as soon as the damage or loss is apparent. Bear in mind that you

cannot legally receive double payment for the same damage. Should this happen you would be responsible for returning any overpayment to the government.

If you sustain property loss or damage, promptly contact the claims office for assistance. YOU must allow both the government and the carrier to inspect the damage if either requests to do so. Do not dispose of any damaged property.

### Household Goods Weight Allowances

Your weight allowance is the maximum weight that can be moved at government expense under the Joint Federal Travel Regulations. Related to your pay grade (please contact the Personal Property Office for exact weights). This allowance includes the weight of household goods you ship, place in storage or send as unaccompanied baggage. Shipment items include household furnishings, appliances, equipment, clothing, personal effects, etc.

You, not your transportation officer or carrier, are responsible for staying within this weight allowance. If the weight of items packed, shipped, or stored, exceeds the amount, you must pay all charges connected with the excess weight.

For this reason, estimating the weight of your household goods is very important. Estimates should start early, even before you visit your transportation office to set up the move. You should make the first estimate because the counselor at your transportation office will ask you how much weight you will be shipping.

An easy and fairly dependable method for making this estimate is to figure 1,000 pounds per room (not including storage rooms or bathrooms) and then add the estimated weight of large appliances and items in the garage, storage rooms, basement, etc.

If, while your goods are being packed and loaded, there is evidence that the shipment will exceed your weight allowance, you may want to call your transportation office. People there can estimate the costs associated with your excess weight. This way

you will be somewhat prepared for charges you will have to pay. If you are separating from the service and will not remain in a pay status, excess costs must be paid in advance of the shipment.

Although there is an entitlement to ship a mobile home, it can be a taxing and also very expensive experience. Because of the many things to take into consideration, such as size, condition, and contents as well as the preparation itself, you should contact the Personal Property Office as soon as possible when you are about to consider your PCS move.

The shipment of a mobile home can cost the military member quite a lot in added expenses, materials, and repairs if he/she is uninformed. The counselors at the Personal Property Office have literature regarding the shipment of a mobile home as well as the requirements that have to be met prior to shipment. They can give you an estimated cost as well as make suggestions on how to keep expenses down.

If you are considering the possible purchase of a mobile home we strongly suggest that you also see a counselor to get the same information as above and possible size options to consider as well as restrictions on mobile homes in certain states.

Another thing you might consider prior to relocating a mobile home is insurance. Ensure you call an insurance company in the state in which you will be stationed to acquire rate information. Every state's insurance rates are different!!!!!!

Note: If both members of a dual military couple are grade E-3 or below, the couple is entitled to a combined weight allowance of 5,000 pounds when both are without dependents.

Note: E-4 under 2 years service 7,000 pounds with dependents, and 3,500 without dependents.

## **POV Out-Bound Shipments**

This information is designed for military and civilian personnel authorized to ship POV's at government expense. It is based on entitlements found in Joint Federal Travel Regulations (JFTR), Volume I, for military members and JFTR Volume II, for civilian employees. In addition, it contains information generally found in Department of Defense 4500.34R, Personal Property Traffic Management Regulation.

One POV by you or your family member may be shipped at government expense overseas. It must, however, be for you or your family member's personal use only. If you desire to make your own arrangements and ship an additional POV, consult your Transportation Office for any restrictions which may apply. You may be required to pay an import duty on a second POV. At the option of the member shipping a vehicle overseas, a motorcycle or moped may be considered a POV if the member does not ship a vehicle with four or more wheels under the same set of military orders. A vehicle under a long-term lease (12 months or longer) may be shipped if you obtain written permission from the leasing company.

The POV should be delivered to the port prior to the departure of the personnel on whose orders the shipment is to be made. This includes dependent travel authorizations when no POV has been previously shipped on the sponsor's orders. Member must have a minimum 12 months remaining on overseas tour at the time vehicle is delivered to loading port. If a military spouse delivers the vehicle to the loading port they must have a Special Power of Attorney.

Make sure your POV is in a safe and operable condition when it is turned in at the port. Failure to do so may be cause for the terminal commander to refuse your POV for shipment.

Make sure your POV meets any host nation emission control and safety standards. The DOD POV Export Control Program is an important program which has been approved and authorized by the Environmental Protection Agency in conjunction with DOD to assist in protecting the catalyst systems on POVs being shipped overseas to countries where unleaded gas is not available. This is done by removing catalyst pellets, converters, and oxygen sensors and by using fuel-line adapters or removing fuel filler pipe constricting devices.

All DOD members, both military and civilian, on PCS orders to or from overseas locations may participate in the ECP. Program participation is voluntary, since all costs associated with the removal and refit of a catalyst system are paid by you. The ECP is limited to 1976 and newer vehicles with catalytic converters.

You must acquire an EPA waiver letter from your local Transportation Office before the emission control components are removed. You will need copies of your PCS orders and vehicle registration, and you must know the date you will turn your POV into the port for shipment. Any emission control equipment which is removed from your POV must be retained in the POV and not shipped or stored separately. The EPA waiver letter will allow you to have your emission control components removed up to 10 working days prior to the turn in of the vehicle to the terminal for shipment.

Your POV may be exposed to freezing temperature during shipment or during storage at the destination terminal. For this reason, you should safeguard the POV's cooling system with a permanent type antifreeze solution. An antifreeze testing to minus 20 F degrees or lower should be used.

You must ensure that your POV contains no more than one-fourth tank of fuel when it is delivered to the loading terminal. A POV with a diesel engine may be shipped with the fuel tank three-quarters full.

All exterior surfaces, including the undercarriage, must be clean and free of soil and other foreign matter before turn-in at the terminal. You may also want to consider rust protection and undercoating prior to shipment.

You may now store your POV on OCONUS orders if the Host Country restricts its shipment. This entitlement does not apply to deployments. You can arrange for storage and get reimbursed afterwards by the DOD; or you can have the DOD pay the storage currently at selected storage places.

Since this entitlement is still fairly new, there may be updates and changes ongoing. Therefore, it is imperative that you contact your Personal Property Counselor as soon as you receive orders OCONUS and find out the restrictions and or options regarding your POV.

Discuss host nation requirements with your local Transportation Office before departing your current duty station. You may be able to do some of the

modifications before you depart. Some may have to be done overseas to prevent violations of the U.S. Emission or Safety Standards during your trip to the port. Also, you should have a valid safety inspection sticker, if one is required, from the state in which the POV is registered. If the state requires an emission control inspection certification, make sure one is affixed to the vehicle.

You must ensure that only authorized personal articles remain in your POV when it is turned in for processing. The value of tools and tool box may not exceed the value prescribed by the JFTR. AM/FM, citizen band, other radios, tape decks, and other accessories not permanently mounted must be removed before turning in the vehicle for shipment. Also, shipment in your POV of any flammable or hazardous substance, including flares, waxes, solvents, and polishes is prohibited. Only the following items of personal property may remain in the vehicle: items considered as normal vehicular tools, such as jacks, tire irons, tire chains, tire inflater, first-aid kits, jumper cables, cribs and child car seats used for the movement of children to or from the port; luggage racks; and small items, such as thermos bottles, bottle warmers, and cushions, used for your comfort and convenience during motor trips to port.

### **Pet Licensing**

Personnel owning dogs who reside on the station must keep their pets on a leash unless away from the housing area. Owner must present, as well, and have complete control of their pet. Animals must be licensed, tagged and registered with the Security Department at the Animal Control Office. Untagged or unlicensed animals will be picked up and turned over to the Corpus Christi Animal Control Office. Tags are issued only after animals have been

immunized against rabies. Semi-domesticated or wild animals (such as wolf-hybrids, ferrets, etc.) are not allowed on base. For questions regarding the status of pets, Veterinarian Services should be contacted at (361)961-3952. A veterinarian's receipt is necessary for proof of immunization. State law requires that animals be immunized each year regardless of the type of vaccine used, and the Animal Control Office must be notified of reimmunization. Additionally, a tag stating owner's name, address and telephone number should be affixed to the collar of the animals. Dog and cat bites should be immediately reported to the Security Department or the Naval Hospital for treatment and observation.

This office will only provide you a license if you adopt a pet and have your animal vaccinated for rabies.

### **Pet Quarantines**

On 13 January 1995, the Texas Department of Health declared an emergency rabies quarantine for all of Texas in an effort to contain epizootics occurring in certain areas of the state. HOWEVER, government employees are exempt as long as the owner provides a valid veterinarian's certificate that states the pet has no diseases and the pet has current rabies inoculations. ### **Pet Transportation**

Once you have decided that your pet is going to be your traveling companion, plan for your pet's trip in the same way you plan your own --well in advance.

PET HEALTH - Nothing can waylay a trip with an animal faster than a health problem, and your pet's well-being should be of primary importance to you. You pet will be subjected to conditions guaranteed to cause stress to your animal. A clean bill of health is an important first step in assuring your pet's ability to adjust safely to unfamiliar surroundings. In addition, most states and countries require recent health certificates and disease inoculation documentation before you will be allowed to cross borders, making a trip to the veterinarian mandatory.

Even if you are traveling within your own state boundaries, it is a good idea to have your pet examined and inoculated. Your pet will be "out of his own back yard" and subject to contact with unknown animals. His chances of contracting disease or infection greatly increase. Have your pet examined by a licensed veterinarian, preferably one who has cared for the animal on a regular basis. Ask the doctor to prescribe a motion sickness pill or sedative as a preventative measure. Don't tranquilize your animal automatically. Sedated animals are more likely to develop problems. (Note: Motion sickness pills are preferable to tranquilizers.) NEVER give your pet tranquilizers without your vet's approval and NEVER give an animal any medication that has been prescribed for human use. Avoid traveling with an animal during extreme weather. Exceptionally cold or hot weather can result in hyper-and hypothermia, heart failure, even death. During summer months, schedule travel for early morning or evening hours.

IDENTIFICATION - A disaster in the making is a pet in transit without identification. Dogs break free

from leashes. Cats dash out of cages cracked open for just a second. The opportunities for pets being separated from their owners are numerous. Avoid the potential loss of a beloved pet by purchasing a comfortable collar (elastic for cats) for your pet bearing complete identification tags. The information should include your pet's name, your name, address and phone number. A license tag is also necessary and can be obtained from your local humane organization. (If your pet is a cat who has never worn a collar, allow time for the cat to become accustomed to wearing something around his neck.

**CARRIERS** - The Carrier in which your pet will be spending most of his trip is of the utmost importance. In fact, the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) has very specific regulations for cages/crates used to transport animals interstate or internationally. **SIZE:** Your pet must have room to turn freely while in a standing position and be able to use normal movements in order to stand erect or lie down in a natural position.

**CONSTRUCTION** - Crates should be constructed of metal, wood or heavy plastic of sufficient strength to withstand the rigorous handling it will receive while your animal is in transit.

The Carrier must have a solid bottom to prevent leakage. Line the bottom with shredded paper or other absorbent material.

**MISCELLANEOUS** - A container for water should be secured to the inside of the carrier positioned so that it can be filled without opening the cage. (Recommend a drip bottle as opposed to an open bowl).

There is a limit to the number of animals permitted per carrier. No more than one adult dog or cat or no more than two puppies or kittens under six months of age or over 20 pounds are allowed in a carrier. (Some exceptions are permitted depending on size of the carrier.)

Carriers must be clearly marked "LIVE ANIMALS" and "THIS END UP" in letters at least one (1) inch high. You should also have both your and the animals identification and destination secured to the outside of the carrier. Include a familiar blanket and a favorite toy in the carrier. It will make your pet more comfortable and less frightened.

**HOUSING** - If you and your pet plan to stay in a hotel, motel or inn, call in advance to check if pets are allowed and make reservations. It is not a good

idea to try and "sneak" a pet in or announce upon your arrival that the reason you need a double room is that your Great Dane is staying with you. You and your pet could be left without a place to stay. (Gaines Pet Foods Corporation publishes "Touring with Bowser", a directory of domestic hotels and motels that accommodate guests with dogs. It is available for a nominal fee by writing to Gaines TWT, P.O. Box 5700, Kankakee, IL 60902.)

If you plan to board your pet at your destination point, reservations are also necessary, especially during the heavy travel periods of holidays and summers. Try to obtain a reliable recommendation for a boarding kennel. (The American Boarding Kennels Association in Colorado, Springs, CO publishes "How to Select a Boarding Kennel" and will make recommendations over the phone when they're not too busy.) Member kennels are listed for the United States and Canada. Call (303) 591-1113 for information.

**RECOMMENDATIONS FOR TRAVELING BY AIRPLANE** - Air travel has become the most common way to transport animals. Unfortunately, it is also the most stressful and most fraught with potential hazards.

Federal regulations provide some solutions to the problems of animals traveling by air but owner awareness is still the key factor in assuring the safe arrival of their pets.

According to federal regulations, an airline cannot accept an animal from its owner unless the following qualifications are met: The animal must be: 1) at least 8 weeks old; 2) certified as healthy within 10 days prior to departure; 3) secured in a carrier which meets the required standards; 4) adequately identified in the manner specified by APHIS. Because airlines can be fined for not adhering to these regulations, animals will be turned away at a ticket counter, so it is to your advantage to be conscientious in preparing for your pet's journey.

**SAFE ENVIRONMENT** - Animals are permitted in both the cabin and cargo sections of airplanes. Pet owners often prefer to have their companion pet in the cabin section with them, and this is possible, but only under the following circumstances: Reservations must be made as early as possible with the airline. Regulations differ from airline to airline, but generally only one animal per flight is allowed in the cabin and permission is granted on a first come, first serve basis.

Because you cannot control the environment of the cargo section, extra care must be taken prior to boarding and after landing which will minimize the difficulties your pet may face while out of your stewardship.

**HANDLING** - The importance of purchasing the proper carrier cannot be stressed often enough. Sufficient ventilation and solid construction are absolute necessities. Most pet travel accidents are a result of poorly constructed carriers.

Arrange for non-stop, direct flights. Animals can be (and have been) left off connecting flights or put on the wrong plane in the same way luggage is mishandled. In addition, every time a stop is made or a plane is changed, your pet's time on the ground and exposure to the elements or time spent in a non-pressurized space increases. Note: If you are flying to a major city, but connecting to a smaller town by commuter line, it is important to know that although a major airline may be willing to transport animals, a commuter line may not.

Reconfirm that your pet is in the luggage area when you check in at the departure gate and ask the senior flight attendant to notify the captain that an animal is on board, either in the cargo or cabin.

**RECOMMENDATIONS FOR TRAVELING BY CAR** - In many ways, traveling with your pet by automobile is the most humane way to go. Although time spent in transit is greatly increased for long distances, the benefits of having your pet with you at all times cannot be overestimated.

Unless your pet is already accustomed to being in an automobile, take the time to acclimate your pet to the motion and sounds of your car by taking short drives prior to leaving on a longer trip. (This precaution may eliminate the need to administer a motion sickness pill or tranquilizer.) Bring a pet carrier, and if the animal has never, or rarely, been in it, allow time for him to become familiar with it. This is especially important if your pet is undisciplined.

Take along your pet's food and water bowls, blanket or bedding and a favorite toy to give him a touch of home.

It is best not to feed an animal for several hours before leaving on a trip. Bring food and fresh water with you and stop regularly once the animal has had a chance to settle down.

If your traveling companion is a cat, bring a litter pan and litter with plastic bags for changing purposes. If a dog is traveling, it is imperative to stop frequently so that he can exercise and relieve himself.

**NEVER LEAVE YOUR PET ALONG IN A PARKED CAR.** In summer, it takes only minutes for the heat to climb to more than 120 degrees, even in the shade. In winter, closed cars become refrigerators on wheels and the cold is as dangerous as summer heat. (In some states it is against the law to leave an animal alone in a car.)

Check your pet frequently so that you can easily tell when he is hungry, thirsty, hot, or tired.

### Separation Procedures

Separations from the military are handled by Personnel Support Activity Detachment, Building 1730. We will research the information and send the answers back to your FFSC within a day or two.

The Fleet and Family Service Center exists for one purpose: to provide you and your family the best, most courteous and most professional assistance possible.

The following information may be useful to you during your relocation. Additional information can be found throughout your Sites booklet.

In 1519, Spanish explorer Alonso Alvarez de Pineda discovered what he reported as a beautiful bay. Since the discovery occurred on the religious feast day of Corpus Christi (The body of Christ), he gave that name to the bay. Eventually the name carried over to the city.

It was in 1839, more than three centuries after Pineda's discovery, that Kinney's Trading Post, was set up near what is now the 400 block of Broadway, and a colony slowly grew up around it. That colony became Corpus Christi and today it has truly become the beautiful city by the bay.

The area abounds in festivals and community activities of interest to all. There are many that are free to the public, such as the summer concerts in the park and many exhibitions. You may check with the Corpus Christi Chamber of Commerce at (361) 881-1888 or the Corpus Christi Area Convention and Tourist Bureau at (361) 881-1888 for additional information.

Corpus Christi enjoys the influence of a large number of cultures and ethnic backgrounds, including Spanish, Black, Irish, and Czech. This is most evident in the architecture and entertainment.

The Corpus Christi Independent School District is the largest of five school districts within the city limits of Corpus Christi. The District has 63 campuses which serve approximately 42, 200 students in pre-kindergarten through grade 12.

There are 5 senior high schools, 11 middle schools, 39 elementary schools and 8 special campuses. In ethnic composition the District is approximately 68 percent Hispanic, 26 percent White, and 6 percent Black.

All PCS families inbound to NAS Corpus Christi should check in with the Navy Lodge located in Building C of the Bachelor Quarters (Building 1281). If quarters are not available at the Navy Lodge, you will be referred to BQ for availability of quarters there. If there are no quarters at BQ, ensure that your orders are stamped with the Navy's NONAVAILABILITY STAMP prior to checking into any off-base lodging. You will need to check in with the Navy Lodge and with the BQ even if you were told by the 1-800-NAVY INN reservation operator that the Navy Lodge and the BQ were full. If arriving after 1800, check in with the Navy Lodge and/or BQ the following day.

The NAS Navy Housing Welcome Center staff welcomes you to NAS Corpus Christi. Your orders state you are to check in with the Navy Housing Welcome Center before you commit to rentals in the community. Failure to do so could render you ineligible for BAH. Our on-base housing waiting list is posted in Building 3600 for your information if you are applying or have applied for on-base housing. To submit your completed housing application you will need a copy of your orders, and a copy of your NAVPERS 1070/602 (Page 2). Your present duty station housing office can verify and forward or FAX the application package to your new duty station. You will be notified by the Navy Housing Welcome Center when your government quarters are available.

The Navy Housing Welcome Center Referral Department can assist you with any information you may need about community housing availability or rental management points of contact. The Navy Housing Welcome Center maintains a list of available rental apartments, condos, townhouses and single family homes. NAS Corpus Christi has a Child Development Center that provides care to children from 4 weeks to 5 years old. The center offers instructional classes and educational activities geared to toddler development, motor skills development and hand-eye coordination. They can be contacted by calling (361) 961-1166 or DSN 861-1166 for more information. If childcare is required upon arrival contact your local Child Development Center to complete a waiting list request form.

To expedite time on the waiting list you may obtain a copy of the application at your nearest CDC and FAX it to (361) 961-2648 or DSN 861-2648.

If you need to borrow household items prior to the arrival of your household goods, be sure to make a trip to the NAS Fleet and Family Service Center, located at the Hospital on the 4th deck between the

hours of 0730 and 1600, Monday through Friday, or call (361) 961-2372.

Before you move pets be sure they have all required vaccinations. Be very careful during the warmer months, as temperatures exceed 100 degrees and animals left in enclosed areas or without adequate shade and water are at risk. During summer, the interior of a car can reach 140 degrees within 30 minutes, which is life-threatening to animals.

Personnel owning dogs who reside on the station must keep their pets on a leash unless away from the housing area. Owners must present and must have complete control of their pet. Animals must be licensed, tagged and registered with the Security Department at the Animal Control Office. Untagged or unlicensed animals will be picked up and turned over to the Corpus Christi Animal Control Office. Tags are issued only after animals have been immunized against rabies. Semi-domesticated or wild animals (such as wolf hybrids, ferrets, etc.) are not allowed on base.

For questions regarding the status of pets, Veterinarian Services should be contacted at (361) 961-3952. A VETERINARIAN S RECEIPT IS NECESSARY for proof of immunization.

A great deal of information is available at the FFSC for family members, including spouse employment, activities in the community and on base, school information, volunteer opportunities, information about recreation, and a myriad of other services. The Corpus Christi Independent School District, the largest of five school districts within the city limits of Corpus Christi, is among the eight urban school districts in Texas. The District has 63 campuses which serve approximately 42,200 students in prekindergarten through grade 12. An instructional staff of more than 2,600 classroom teachers is complemented by a support staff of more than 2,000.

There are five senior high schools, 11 middle schools, 39 elementary schools; and 8 special campuses. In ethnic composition the District is approximately 68 percent Hispanic, 26 percent White, and 6 percent Black.

High schools have regular and honor programs; grades and career pursuits determine program placement. Each high school has its own program called Operation Intervention, which allows students to work at their own pace. There is a night school located at Moody High School, hours 4:00 to 9:00 or 10:00 p.m. NJROTC is offered at all high schools.

The middle schools contain grades 6,7, & 8. One middle school, Baker, is part of the Athena Program for gifted and talented students. Admittance is determined by scores on tests administered in the spring, summer and fall and by teacher recommendation.

One of the 39 elementary schools, Windsor Park, provides a program for the gifted and talented, representing the top 3% of the elementary students in the district. Admittance to the program is determined by scores from tests given in the spring, summer, and

fall, and by teacher recommendation. One of the 39 elementary schools, Chula Vista Academy of Fine Arts emphasizes art, music, and drama in addition to reading, mathematics, and composition. Students must demonstrate interest in the arts and apply for admission.

Special Emphasis Schools (SES) are located at seven elementary schools and one middle school. The SES setting is based on the belief that some students do best in a highly structured curriculum. Strong emphasis is placed on basic skills, good citizenship, discipline, and enrichment.

#### ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to attend the school appropriate for the student's grade level within the attendance area where the student's parent or legal guardian resides. Some district-approved transfers are available.

A certified birth certificate or other document which proves the student's identity must be furnished to the District within 30 days of enrollment.

All students must be immunized against certain diseases or must present a certificate or statement indicating that, for medical or religious reasons, the students should not be immunized. State law requires the following immunizations: diphtheria, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps, rubella, and hemophilias influenza.

## Survival Tips For First Termers

### Survival Tips for First Termers Overview

Being in the Navy is an opportunity and a proud tradition of more than 200 years of service. It is also a challenge as single and married Navy members juggle their duties, personal and financial obligations, and the demands of an immediate or extended family.

Navy personnel and their families are envied for the variety of their experiences and the number of places they travel and live in. To make this attractive, mobile life style possible, a great amount of planning and preparation is necessary.

Listed below are some "Survival Tips" to help you and your family as you face the challenges and opportunities of the Mobile Military Lifestyle.

### Before You Move

As soon as you receive your orders, visit your Family Service Center Relocation Assistance Program Manager. They have an extensive array of services and resources available for you, including a SITES (Standard Installation Topic Exchange Service) booklet on your new duty station, information and classes on planning a move, Welcome Aboard Packages, lending locker, etc.

Contact the Household Goods Office for an appointment with a counselor to schedule your household goods move. During your counseling session, your counselor will provide you a great deal of valuable information. Pay attention to details, take notes, ask questions and follow directions. Failure to adhere to guidelines can be costly in time and money.

Notify your landlord, rental agent or Housing Office of your Permanent Change of Station (PCS) orders and anticipated date of departure. If there is a military clause in your lease, you must give this notification in writing.

Request a sponsor at your new duty station. This person can be your vital link to your new home. Your sponsor can send you specific information on your new location and assist you when you arrive.

Begin a calendar for your move. Include items to remember - change of address cards, school records for your children, travel arrangements for your pets, etc.

Notify your friends, relatives, etc. of your upcoming move.

Start budgeting for the move. Contact your Finance Office or PSD to discuss your options regarding advance pay and travel funds. Even with your entitlements, special pay, allotments, etc., moving can be expensive. In addition, families facing the loss of one income during the relocation will feel additional financial impact.

This is by no means everything you'll have to remember! Check with your Relocation Counselor at your Family Service Center. They can provide you with complete checklists and many helpful publications to assist you with remembering all the details!

So many things to remember! You will find that services and procedures vary from base to base. When getting acquainted with your new base be sure to find out:

Location of medical facility and procedures for emergency and walk-in care  
Check cashing limits, procedures and hours of operation of the exchange and commissary - order new checks with your new address  
Most importantly, remember help is just a phone call away. When in doubt - ask. Call your Relocation Counselor any time. If they don't know the answer, they will find it.

Contact your sponsor prior to leaving to ensure that he/she will help you with any arrangements you may need upon arrival, such as a ride from the airport, hotel/BEQ/BOQ reservations, etc.

## After You Arrive

Contact your Relocation Assistance Program Manager! He/she has all the information you'll need once you arrive at your new duty station, from housing availability, how to register your children in the local schools, to setting your spouse up to see the Spouse Employment Assistance Program Manager at the Fleet & Family Support Center!

Contact the Housing Office BEFORE making any arrangements for civilian housing. Rental/lease agreements are extremely important and are sometimes complicated. If you haven't already done so, now is the time to put your name on the waiting list for base housing.

Notify the Personal Property Office of your new address and to check on the status of your household goods. Have they arrived? Are they in storage? How much storage time am I entitled to? How do I file a claim if there is damage? All important questions to ask now that you've arrived!

Once you've found the perfect home and your worldly possessions have arrived, the job of getting acquainted with your new neighborhood begins.

Contact utility companies to make arrangements for connections.

On moving in day, if you have small children, you might want to make arrangements for child care. Older children might want to help by checking off boxes as they come in or unpacking the special box of their belongings.

Be at your home before the movers arrive. Have an idea of where you want things placed - the movers will only put your couch in one place.

Check your belongings carefully and make sure to note on the inventory any damaged or missing items so you can file a claim at the Personal Property Office.

So many things to remember! You will find that services and procedures vary from base to base. When getting acquainted with your new base be sure to find out: a) speed limits, b) location of medical facility and procedures for emergency and walk-in care, c) check cashing limits, procedures and hours of operation of the exchange and commissary, d) order new checks with your new address, and e) most importantly, remember, help is just a phone call away. When in doubt - ask. Call your Relocation

Assistance Program Manager any time. If he/she doesn't have the answer, he/she will connect you to someone who will.

## Reporting Procedures

During working hours (between 0730 and 1600), check in with PSD, Bldg 1731.

After working hours, check-in with OOD, Bldg 2. OOD will stamp your orders. At 0730 the next working day, report to PSD at Bldg 1731. For lodging refer below.

## PCS FAMILIES INBOUND

All PCS families inbound to NAS Corpus Christi should check-in with the Navy Lodge, located in Bldg "C" of the BOQ, Bldg 1281. If quarters are not available at the Navy Lodge, ensure that your orders are STAMPED with the Navy Lodge NON-AVAILABILITY stamp prior to checking into off station hotels. You will need to check-in with the Navy Lodge even if you were told by the 1-800-NAVY-INN reservation number that the Navy Lodge was full. The front desk of the Navy Lodge closes at 1800 (6:00 p.m.) each day. If arriving after 1800 (6:00 p.m.), check in with the Lodge the following day.

In addition to the Navy Lodge, Laguna Shores and the BOQ have limited spaces for families on a space available basis. Both the Navy Lodge and Laguna Shores must be full to utilize units at the BOQ. Laguna Shores is a remodeled two bedroom apartment complex with a covered carport which can be rented on a daily rate.

## PCS MILITARY MEMBERS WITHOUT FAMILIES

Military personnel traveling without families must check in with the Bachelor Enlisted Quarters, or Bachelor Officers Quarters as appropriate. For OFFICERS, check in at the front desk of Bldg 1281 (24 hours a day) for both TRANSIENT and PERMANENT PARTY rooms. For enlisted transients, check in with the front desk of Bldg 1281

(BOQ) for TRANSIENT ENLISTED rooms (24 hours a day). ENLISTED PERMANENT PARTY Personnel or ENLISTED GEOGRAPHICAL BACHELORS, you should check in at Bldg 1739 (BEQ).

## Travel Planning

The physical process of moving from one location to another can be a semi-holiday or a chaotic series of gas station stops. As you plan your trip, try to limit your daily journey to distances your family can tolerate. It could save you and your family some uncomfortable, restless miles. Confirm your travel reservations before you leave. If you are traveling with pets, be sure that the hotels you've chosen accepts pets on the premises. If they don't, you need to make kennel arrangements with each hotel in advance.

Check with your Relocation Assistance Program Manager at your Fleet & Family Support Center. Many have AUTOMAP programs that will help you plan your numbers and locations to make your overnight stays more affordable.

When you're on the road, remember to keep track of mileage and all expenses. Many expenses are tax deductible if you file on a "long" tax form. Keep all receipts. If you don't need them later you can disregard them.

Let each day flow with the daily plan.

Infants have few concerns outside their immediate environment. They take the "cues" from you: are you angry and frustrated, or relaxed and content?

Young children do best when kept on the same eating and sleeping routine. Introduce new sights and sounds with patience.

Elementary school children may be losing their first friends. Allow for expression of grief in daily decisions.

## HINTS FOR TRAVELING WITH KIDS

Young children have a natural wariness of the unknown. Including them in the planning can help alleviate fears.

Stick to your child's usual bedtime and mealtimes, and read his or her favorite story. Unpack the minute you arrive so everyone feels at home.

Balance your day, allowing plenty of time for a romp in the park or other relaxing activities. Even when having fun, kids have a limited attention span.

## PACKING POINTERS

Take one small bag per person. Let each child take only one special toy - or you'll find yourself carrying kid's possessions around the amusement park. Don't forget a first aid kit, with disinfectant, band-aids, tylenol, etc. Tuck in a nylon folding suitcase - great for lugging home your souvenirs or dirty laundry.

Call ahead to confirm hotel services for children, such as cribs and cots.

## Vehicle Ownership

Because different states have different insurance laws, your insurance company will need to know where and when you are moving. In addition to automobile insurance, attention must be given to driver's licenses and auto registration. To avoid penalties, make sure all autos are properly inspected and registered and that all family members that are driving are properly licensed and insured.

**DRIVER'S LICENSE:** A valid operator's license from another state is accepted in Texas for you and your family members. However, if your spouse should become employed in the state during your

tour of duty in Texas, she/he has 30 days to obtain a Texas driver's license.

**VEHICLE REGISTRATION:** Requirements to register a vehicle in Texas are as follows: a) prior to applying for Texas registration, you must have the vehicle inspected at an approved station and obtain Form VA-30A, Certificate of Inspection, b) non-Texas residents must provide out-of-state title or registration, certificate of inspection and proof of liability insurance. You will Pay: 1) \$13.00 - title fee; \$15.00 - new resident fee; 2) \$5.00 or \$10.00 bridge fee, depending on county of residence; and a license plate fee of \$50.00 to \$70.00, depending on the year of your vehicle; c) Texas residents must provide title or registration, certificate of inspection and proof of liability insurance. You will pay: 1) \$13.00 - title fee; 2) bridge and license fee as indicated above, and 3) the difference in states sales tax if you paid less than 6.25 percent.

**AUTOMOBILE SAFETY INSPECTIONS:** If your automobile is registered in the State of Texas, inspection stickers may be obtained at any certified inspection station. If you choose to retain out-of-state license plates, you will need to obtain a Texas safety inspection sticker when yours expires. If your state of registration does not require a safety inspection sticker you are not required to have a Texas inspection sticker.

**SEAT BELTS:** In Texas, seat belts are mandatory for the driver and front seat passengers 5 years of age and over and all children between the ages of 2 and 4, regardless of location in the vehicle. Approved child seats are required for all children up to 2 years old.

**AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE:** Auto liability insurance is mandatory. You must carry proof of insurance in your car. There are fines for operation of a motor vehicle without the legal minimum. Fines start at \$200.00. Liability insurance is also required to operate a motor vehicle on Naval Air Station Corpus Christi. If you desire to keep your current insurance company verify that your company is licensed to operate in Texas.

There are several insurance companies in the local area providing car/renters/homeowners insurance. Please check the local phone directory for a complete listing and then shop around to find the company that best meets your individual needs.

## **Housing and Billeting**

Navy personnel are required to report to the Housing Referral Office at their new duty station upon arriving and before buying or leasing a home or apartment. If you are applying for base housing, send an advanced housing application to the Housing Referral Office with a copy of your Page 2 and a copy of your orders. To be placed on a waiting list based on your detachment date from the last duty station, not your reporting date, you must report to the Housing Welcome Center within 30 days after reporting to activate your application.

The Housing Referral Office can assist you in locating off base housing and will provide information on the local community. The Housing Referral Center maintains a computer based listing of local housing - costs, deposit requirements, pet information, location of schools to the property, etc.

If no base housing is available, or if you choose to live in the civilian community, you and your family are entitled to receive Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) to help you pay for housing.

Make sure that if a lease is required, you have a "military clause" which will allow you to end the lease early without financial penalties if:

You receive Permanent Change of Station (PCS) orders. You leave active duty, you must give a 30 day written notice.

Not all military clauses will protect you, especially if you are waiting for on-base housing. Be sure to check with the Housing Referral Office before you sign a lease for housing in town. It could save you lots of time and money in the long run!!!

In addition to the military clause, also make sure that your lease or rental agreement states clearly who pays for what utilities and what repairs. Then, if you decide that the agreement is satisfactory, walk through the apartment or house with the landlord, and make a list of any existing damage to the property. Have the landlord sign the list, and make a copy of it to keep with your copy of the lease.

Finally, pay your rent on time, and leave the property in as good condition as you found it in order to create goodwill for future service member tenants.

## **Money Matters**

The costs associated with PCS orders can be debilitating for even the most solid budget. Though

there are reimbursements for costs associated with PCS moves, research demonstrates the average military family reports out of pocket expenses of over \$500.00 and that only one out of every three dollars is reimbursed. Listed below are some of the PCS moving allowances you can plan on to help you budget for your move.

**DISLOCATION ALLOWANCE (DLA):** Active duty personnel with family members moving from a permanent duty station are entitled to a dislocation allowance. This is paid to offset the costs of closing one home and setting up another. This allowance is equal to two months BAQ. DLA is not available to those transferring in the same geographical location. DLA may be dispersed at the time of travel, or upon arrival at the gaining command.

**MILEAGE IN LIEU OF TRANSPORTATION (MALT):** Service members receive MALT when they drive to a new assignment. The allowance is computed on federal tables of mileage between the old and new duty stations. Even though the official distance may be longer or shorter than the service member drives, the official distance determines the allowance payable. MALT is also paid to those going overseas if they drive from their stateside location to the port of embarkation for transcontinental plane or ship, or from the port of debarkation to the new duty station.

Single active duty or spouse traveling alone - .15 per mile  
Two family members..... - .17 per mile  
Three family members..... - .19 per mile  
Four or more family members..... - .20 per mile

These rates apply to spouses authorized to travel alone or with family members, and to sponsors traveling with family members. These rates also apply to travel in a second car when its use is authorized. MALT will be dispersed at the time of travel.

**PER DIEM ALLOWANCE:** Along with DLA and MALT, food and lodging are allotted when making a PCS move. The allowance is paid at a rate of 350 miles per day. Service members receive \$50.00 a day plus \$37.50 a day for their spouses and each family member under the age of twelve. When a spouse

travels separately, the spouse receives \$50.00 a day; and for family members traveling with the spouse it is \$37.50 a day or \$25.00 a day, depending on the age.

**TEMPORARY LODGING EXPENSE ALLOWANCE (TLE):** New arrivals at overseas bases are eligible for this allowance to help offset the cost of temporary housing and meals. You are entitled to TLA even if you move into temporary government quarters. The amount of TLA depends on several factors, including family size, local per diem rate, actual cost of quarters and whether the quarters provide cooking or dining facilities. A single person gets 65% of the local per diem rate if actual expenses are that much, and a member with one or two family members gets 100% of the local per diem rate if expenses warrant. For each additional family member the per diem rate is raised by 25%. TLA is paid in fifteen day increments, and usually up to a sixty day limit for those arriving and a ten day limit for those departing overseas.

**ADVANCED PAY:** \*\*\*Drawing advance pay should be carefully considered when planning a move. As soon as you get your orders, a spending plan should be developed early enough to save extra money to be used to assist with the moving expenses. Many times advance pay is spent on other "emergencies" and is not around to assist with moving expenses. In addition, advance pay is a "dead horse" that automatically reduces your take home pay to use for bills and unforeseen moving expenses. Talk to your Command Financial Specialist prior to drawing advance pay.\*\*\*

No more than three months advance pay may be drawn. The advance is normally repaid in equal installments over twelve months. In certain cases, re-payment can be spread over twenty-four months. Advance pay is your base pay, not pay with allowances. If approved by your Commanding Officer, an advanced housing allowance can be drawn. You must prove that this money will be used for housing costs. Advance housing allowance is up to three months BAQ and VHA. Advance housing allowance may be re-paid over a twelve month period, and in exceptional circumstances, may be re-paid over a longer period. REMEMBER, \*\*\*ALL ADVANCE PAY IS TO BE RE-PAID\*\*\*\*
